Aquamarines are the second most famous beryl member and the birthstone for March. The name aquamarine means "seawater" because most natural aquamarines are a light to medium blue with green undertones, caused by iron impurities. Colors range from pure baby blue to deep blue.

The most famous aquamarine mine among gem connoisseurs is the Santa Maria mine in Brazil. For the last 100 years it has produced both the largest
